Guidelines for Authors

The editor of Botswana Notes and Records is pleased to receive manuscripts (maximum 8,000 words) from any contributor as long as it is typed and written in a clear style free of jargon and appropriate for non-specialist readers. Scholarly submissions must be original and be related to the existing literature. Scholarly articles are refereed before acceptance. Final acceptance is at the editor's discretion, as is their appearance in the articles or notes section. The editor reserves the right to make changes to all manuscripts accepted for publication, in consultation with the authors.
